### **California Climate Action Registry Welcomes HP as Newest Member**

MONTREAL, Canada – The California Climate Action Registry (Registry), a distinguished group of organizations demonstrating leadership by voluntarily taking action on climate change, today announced HP as its newest member. As a member, HP will work with the Registry to annually track, report and certify its nationwide greenhouse gas emissions, the main drivers of global warming.

The announcement took place during the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) Conference of the Parties (COP11) meeting.

"HP is a company known for innovation and leadership – it continues to lead the way on climate change issues by voluntarily tracking and publicly reporting its emissions with the Registry," said Diane Wittenberg, President of the California Climate Action Registry.

The Registry, created by the California legislature in 2000, helps companies and organizations throughout the United States to track, publicly report and reduce their greenhouse gas emissions. The results are certified by an independent third-party to ensure compliance with Registry protocols and standardization across participants and sectors. The Registry has been internationally recognized as a gold standard for public reporting of greenhouse gases.

"Our participation in the California Climate Action Registry allows us to openly demonstrate the progress of our climate change programs," said David Lear, Vice President of Corporate, Social and Environmental Responsibility at HP.
