Governor Gray Davis today announced the appointments of Dr. Charles F. Kennel, Robert A. Malone, Peter M. Miller, and Jan E. Schori as members of the California Climate Action Registry Board of Directors.

Dr. Kennel, 62, of La Jolla, is the Director, Dean, Vice Chancellor, and a Professor of Marine Sciences at the University of California, San Diego Scripps Institution of Oceanography. He was the Executive Vice Chancellor and a Professor at the University of California, Los Angeles, and an Associate Administrator of NASA, in charge of the Mission to Planet Earth Enterprise. Dr. Kennel is also a member of the American Physical Society, American Geophysical Union, American Academy of Arts and Sciences, National Academy of Sciences, and a member and fellow of the California Council on Science and Technology. He earned a bachelor of arts degree from Harvard College, and a Ph.D. from Princeton University.

Mr. Malone, 49, of Pasadena, has more than 27 years of experience in the business community and is a Regional President of BP. Previously, he was President of Alyeska Pipeline Service Co. and BP Pipeline. Mr. Malone is a member of the Los Angeles World Affairs Council, National Petroleum Council, Los Angeles Town Hall, California Business Roundtable, Los Angeles Business Advisors, and the California Chamber of Commerce. He earned a bachelor of science degree from the University of Texas at El Paso, and a master of science in management degree from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, where he was an Alfred P. Sloan Fellow.

Mr. Miller, 42, of Berkeley, is a Senior Scientist at the National Resources Defense Council, where he has worked for 11 years. He was an Energy Analyst at Environmental Defense in Washington, DC. Mr. Miller earned a bachelor of arts degree from Reed College, and a master of arts degree from Dartmouth College.

Ms. Schori, 48, of Sacramento, has worked for the Sacramento Municipal Utility District for 22 years and has been serving as the General Manger for seven years. She is the vice chair of the Large Public Power Council, and on the Board of Directors and the Executive Committee of the American Public Power Association. Ms. Schori is also a member of the National Business Council for Sustainable

Energy Board, California Municipal Utilities Association Board, and Western Energy Institute. She earned a bachelor of arts degree from the University of California, Berkeley, and a juris doctorate degree from the University of California, Davis.

The purpose of the Climate Action Registry is to help various entities in the state to establish emissions baselines against which any future federal greenhouse gas emission reduction requirements may be applied. The Climate Action Registry is also responsible for ensuring that sources in the state receive appropriate consideration for verified emissions reductions under any future regulatory regime relating to greenhouse gas emissions. Members do not receive a salary. These positions do not require Senate confirmation.
