GHG Emission Reporting Protocols

- Local Government Operations Protocol
 - GHG emissions reporting for municipal operations
 - Approved by ARB, CCAR, and ICLEI Boards
- Program Neutral Guidance
- Methodologies to Calculate GHG Emission Inventory
- Does Not Quantify Emission Reductions from Projects
- Available Online:
 - www.arb.ca.gov/cc/protocols/localgov/localgov.htm
- Community-scale GHG Emissions Inventory Protocol
 - Will begin in late 2008

Local Government Operations Protocol

- Direct and Indirect Emissions from:
 - Buildings and other facilities
 - Streetlights and traffic signals
 - Water delivery and wastewater treatment facilities
 - Port and airport facilities
 - Vehicle and transit fleets
 - Power generation facilities
 - Solid waste facilities
 - Other process and fugitive emissions
- Emission Inventory Can Assist In:
 - Tracking annual performance
 - Identification of reduction opportunities
 - Creating a strategy to further reduce emissions
- Does Not Cover GHG Reduction Projects

Climate Calculators

- California Registry Reporting Online Tool (CARROT)
 - California Registry's online GHG reporting tool
 - No longer accepting members after end of October 08
- Clean Air and Climate Protection Software
 - ICLEI (Local Governments for Sustainability) software for estimating municipal operations and community scale GHG emissions inventory.
 - Being updated by end of 2008
